**The Bishops Conference of England & Wales** – Will host a Eucharistic Pilgrimage and Congress in the Echo Arena, Liverpool, 7 - 9 September 2018. This is a national pastoral initiative based on the centrality of the Eucharist. The 'pilgrimage' aspect denotes the faith journey of the individual person.

<u>Who is invited?</u> Parish representatives, catechists, extraordinary ministers, RE leaders, clergy, religious orders, seminarians, hospital and prison chaplains, who are all pastorally involved and on the front line of evangelisation. The Southwark Diocese can sent 570 delegates. Each parish can select, finance and send two representatives. Each school can send one representative.

What is a Eucharistic Congress? This is an ecclesial gathering of lay and ordained people from each diocese in England & Wales. Participants will take part in a series of Catechism sessions, focusing on different dimensions of the Eucharist. This is a very positive opportunity for prayer, theological reflection and discernment.

20<sup>th</sup> Sunday Reflection: Mark's Gospel was the first to be written, and Matthew edits and expands it, using other sources as well. In Mark, this Gospel scene is the only explicit encounter between Jesus and a gentile – and a woman at that! At first Jesus is reluctant to do anything for her, for his mission was primarily to Israel. He puts her off, and is really quite brusque to her. However, she wins through by her persistence and her determined confidence in his power. The disciples get fed up with her shrieking after them, and ask Jesus to cure her daughter, which he does.

We need to be persistent in our prayers and in our efforts. God does not grant a casual request. Secondly, this passage reveals a lot about Jesus' relationship to women and about his sense of humour: Jesus and the woman seem to tease each other with their repartee. There is the same repartee in the account of Jesus' meeting with the Samaritan women in the gospel of John: she stands up to him with her cheeky responses. Jesus and the woman are both obviously enjoying this playful scene. It suggests that not everything is solemn and serious in heaven, and there is room for a sense of humour!

**Questions for reflection:** Is Jesus rude to the Canaanite woman, or is he merely challenging her? How does Jesus challenge you? Dom Henry Wansbrough OSB
