GOOD FRIDAY – Walk of Witness with Open Air Service at the Civic Centre:

Jesus was crucified publicly, and so we proclaim publicly the events of the Cross and their meaning. Meet at 10:20am outside St Teresa's, to leave at 10:30am with our wooden cross. Walk to the Civic Centre (about 1.25 miles) for an 11:15am Open Air Service outside the Civic Centre in Morden. Followed by Coffee & Hot Cross Buns.

HOLY WATER

Holy water is a sacramental that remits venial sin. Because of the blessing attached to it, Holy Church strongly urges its use upon her children, especially when dangers threaten, such as fire, storms, sickness and other calamities. Every Catholic home always should have in it a supply of holy water.

We do not take advantage of the benefits derived from holy water.

Let us cultivate its use. Untold spiritual wealth is concentrated in a tiny drop of blessed water and we give it so little thought! Did we realize now, as we shall realize after death, the many benefits which may be derived from holy water, we would use it far more frequently, and with greater faith and reverence. Holy water has its great power and efficacy from the prayers of the Church, which its Divine Founder always accepts with complacency.
